2026 CONSTRUCTION NEWS

CONSTRUCTION IS STARTING SOON!

Work will include:

- Minor utility work in the roadway (gate valve, storm structures, manholes)
- Spot replace damaged curb and gutters
- Rehabilitate roadway pavement
 - Grind-up existing asphalt and install new surface pavement
- Trail and sidewalk rehabilitations
 - Grind-up existing trail and install new surface pavement
 - Reconstruct pedestrian sidewalk ramps
- City Hall and Community Center parking lot Improvements
- New trail from Commons Park to Mound Ave

There will be no assessments for this project.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

Roads will be open to local traffic. Minor delays can be expected if work is being performed directly in front of your driveway.

WORK ZONE SAFETY

Heavy equipment and construction activity can be dangerous. **Please talk with your children about the dangers of a construction site.** Drive slow through the work areas. We appreciate your help in maintaining a safe work zone for all.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS

No street parking between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. during construction activities. Even though you may not see construction equipment on-site, work will be on-going and schedules can change quickly.

RIGHT-OF-WAY

Invisible fences, in-ground sprinkler systems, and landscaping located near the existing street or water and sewer services are in the city right-of-way are potentially in the path of the construction project.

To reduce the risk of damage during construction, **homeowners are asked to either temporarily move or mark them with a flag, stake, or blue paint.** We suggest you remove any sprinkler heads and plug lines located near the street. MAIL, TRASH AND RECYCLING

Mail delivery is anticipated to continue as usual. You will be informed if a temporary mailbox is needed.

Trash and recycling will be picked up as scheduled for properties within the project site. Continue to place your trash and recycling curbside by 7 a.m. on your regularly scheduled pickup day. If the collection trucks are unable to drive down the street, the contractor will move the carts to an area where they can be reached, then return the cart to your driveway. **Please write your address on your carts so they can be returned to the right property.**
